

CHURCH RENEWAL LAB VISION SUMMARY

The Church Renewal Lab is a two-year renewal journey for the purpose of developing intentional

missional congregations that make more and better disciples who transform lives and communities for Christ

2. The purpose of the Lab

The Renewal Lab has been designed to come along side any congregation seeking to revitalize ministry by regaining a focus on their missional calling. Congregations participating in the Renewal Lab will begin a journey toward:

- \checkmark Identifying a unique mission and vision
- ✓ Developing tools for making more and better disciples
- ✓ Becoming Gospel-centered in everything they do
- ✓ Changing the atmosphere through congregational health
- ✓ Implementing the priorities of the Acts 2:42-47 N.T. church
- 3. The Renewal Lab's Journey
 - ✓ Cohorts of 5-10 churches journeying together virtually
 - ✓ 6 quarterly renewal gatherings (The Learning Labs)
 - ✓ A three-step process: Listen. Imagine. Do.
 - ✓ Team formation to help guide the renewal process
 - ✓ Congregational Involvement
 - ✓ Multiple coaches for various aspects of ministry
 - \checkmark Unpacking the essentials and tools of renewal
- 4. The expectation of the Lab
 - ✓ A one-plus-one commitment (first year commitment with option for second year)
 - ✓ A gift to the Lab for each gathering to help cover a portion of the expenses
 - ✓ The formation of a team that stays committed to the process during its duration
 - \checkmark The pastor is granted permission to invest in the renewal journey
 - ✓ The signing of a covenant agreeing to the above stated expectations
- > When possible, an in-person visit to the church will be made when a covenant has been submitted

Investments Prior to First Learning Lab:

- ✓ The CRL congregational team is formed
- ✓ Thriving essentials is viewed
- ✓ A congregational prayer for renewal event is held
- ✓ The congregation reads ACTS Scripture reading guide
- ✓ The council CRL introduction video is viewed and discussed
- ✓ Listening exercises begin to the extent that time permits (i.e. "Time to Remember", SWOT, Community Visits, etc.)
- \checkmark Pastor takes the Birkman Assessment and receives coaching around the results


